What does it mean to be a refugee?

A refugee is someone who is forced to leave their home country because they are afraid for their lives.








When they arrive in a new country, the government there must decide whether or not they can stay.

If they are allowed to stay then they become known as refugees. While they are waiting for a decision, they are known as people seeking asylum.



In 2015 Imogen, a local Bristol mum, found a photo of young Alan Kurdi's body lying on a Mediterranean beach.

Alan was two years old, and had lost his life with his mother and brother when a crowded, small boat sank in the sea trying to run away from war and find safety.

Imogen thought; "What if this happened to me? What if I had to flee a war and lost my children because no one protected us?".





She wanted to help people in these situations.

That's when she asked her neighbours and friends to help her create Aid Boxes, like the ones in the picture below.

These boxes would be filled with essential living items, like food tins, underwear, socks, toilet paper, jumpers, toothbrushes, etc., and would be given to people who were fleeing war and violence.







When the boxes were ready, Imogen and her friends decided to bring them to a refugee camp in France. In this camp, people looking for a safe place to call home were waiting to continue their journey.

The people in the camp owned almost nothing, and lived in very bad conditions.

Imogen and her friends stayed in the camp for a year to make these living conditions better and teach people about what was happening there.





Once Imogen had returned to her life and family in Bristol, she learnt that there were people who needed her help here too.

That is when she founded the charity Aid Box Community, a Free Shop and Hub that would welcome people with open arms and support them feel settled in Bristol.



What is life like as someone who is seeking safety?

Here are a few ways that life can be difficult for a refugee in the UK:

- Having a small amount of money to live on
- Not having somewhere stable to live
- Not speaking the language
- Having no friends or family nearby
- Facing a complicated and long process
- Not being allowed to work
- Not knowing how things work in this new country and how to find help



Who is Aid Box Community today?

Aid Box Community is a Bristol-based charity that provides support, supplies, and sanctuary to people seeking safety here. We help people by giving them a choice of free, living items, and a community to welcome them into our city.





Who is Aid Box Community today?

FREE SHOP & HUB

Where we provide a warm welcome and a choice of free, quality living essentials.



ACTIVITY GROUPS

Women's, men's, & mixed social & activity groups such as yoga, football, swimming, & cookery. Trips & retreats.



CONNECTIONS

We connect local people with refugees & asylum seekers for 1-to-1 friendship.

CRISIS FUND

Emergency support for people who are in crisis

WELFARE & SIGNPOSTING



We guide people to other services they might need.

BUS FARES

We provide bus fares for all service users to access our services if it is too far to walk.
