Key Responsibilities	Running the sessions: Arriving before the session to set up the space; drinks, snacks and close the space. Ensuring that the space is safe and always welcoming. When required, collect fruit donation from Better Food Company before the session.

Register: Keeping register of attendees. Registering new members to ABC if they haven't accessed the charity before. An iPad will be provided.

Activities: Regularly ask for feedback from the members to help build these sessions and work this those within the group to facilitate their own sessions. Feedback to Activity Groups Coordinator who will research and find resources to provide those sessions.

Welfare and Safeguarding: Report any welfare or safeguarding concerns to Imogen and Heather.

Aid Box Community may request tasks other reasonable tasks be carried in addition to your main job role.
